Track Season Starting

Ka-chow! Is that Lightning Mcqueen? No, it's our track team getting ready for our 2024 track season to start! Let's start with the special events like shot put, long jump, high jump, pole vault, and a new event that's coming called discus. The first special event I'll talk about is shot put. Shot put is when you take a metal ball (boys get a 8-pound ball and girls get a 6-pound ball in middle school) and step into this ring on the ground, which is where you throw the ball from. You might think you can throw it like a baseball or softball, but you would be wrong because you could hurt your elbow if you did. The point is to throw the ball the furthest and you get three tries. Girls go against girls and boys go against boys. Next is pole vault. I personally don't do this one, but I do watch it a lot. Pole vault is where you have a pole and stick in the ground and try to push yourself over a bar high in the air. I don't think that I want to do the pole vault since I don't necessarily like it. Next is long jump. Long jump is where you run down this strip of track that's 29 feet and 2 inches long. There's a big sandbox that they have to jump across. Next is the high jump, which is similar to pole vault. You have to jump over a bar as high as you can and land on a mat. Discus is a sport normally done in high school, but they are bringing it into middle school for the first time! I'm excited because I will for sure be doing it. It's kind of like a shot put but with a disc and a bigger ring on the ground. Each person runs 200 meters, which is half of the track. I like this event because you can start kind of slow and then you can speed up when you need to. It was kind of like the 4 X 100 relay, but instead of using a baton, you use a girls' shot put ball as the baton. 
Once he was done exploring the world, he settled down in Boyne City. He then became a teacher at Mancelona Middle School, where he hopes to stay put.


The final question I asked him was who his idol was. He said his idol was Orson Welles because he directed what many call the greatest movie of all time, Citizen Kane.



It has been such a long time since a triple-A studio has made a good FPS (first person shooter). Due to this, indie game studios have been experimenting trying to find their next big thing. While indie studios were on the race to a diamond in the rough, Embark Studios made a godsend. It re-invented the fun of an FPS shooter with some of the best movement since Call of Duty's slide canceling and the overall fun of prime Fortnite. But why is it so fun? Let us dive into why.

Movement

Movement is a big part of any FPS shooter. Bad movement makes the game feel stale and lowers the skill ceiling. I believe that THE FINALS does not have the best movement. It is quite simple, but it is similar to most games with the basics of running, sliding, and jumping. Other types of movement are ziplines and launch pads. If you place a launch pad at an angle, it sends you more forward. If you slide onto it, it has similar effects too. There is nothing special about the zipline, though. It makes up for basic movement with its light class. The light class is small and dangerous, which makes it my personal favorite. Its abilities are a grapple to pull or swing yourself somewhere and a dashing ability that can be used to cross big gaps. When used right, it can be so much fun. There are also other more advanced movement methods, but I do not have enough time. However you do it, it all feels smoother than the fabric of a fresh shirt.

Guns

When you think of any first-person shooter, you think of guns! So of course they are a big part of making an FPS shooter fun. If the guns feel simple and horrible, then it drains the fun of being a mad man! THE FINALS has some of the best guns and weapons. Some examples are swords, automatic shotguns, sledge hammers, throwing knives, and a literal flamethrower. None of the guns are inherently better. What seems good can be countered by a lot of other guns. There are no guns that are better than any other gun. For the most part, some weapons are easier to use than others and may seem better, but just search "clips of best sword player in THE FINALS." Since the guns are all balanced, it makes it much more rewarding. Also, some weapons are good for destroying walls, allowing you to feel incredibly awesome when you smash through a wall and kill all the bad guys like a movie star. Those reasons are why THE FINALS has better guns than any other game on the market.

Game Modes

THE FINALS has an original idea. It turns out, if you want a popular game, you need original ideas. THE FINALS main game mode is quick cash. The rules require you to get to a vault which you need to begin to unlock. While you unlock the vault, you must protect it with your different utilities and fight to protect it from the other players who want to take it for themselves. Once you do that, you must bring it to a cash-out station and do the same thing you did when you unlocked it. Then repeat until you have twenty thousand dollars. I am not a big fan, but I have fun playing it from time to time.

The secondary game mode, and my personal favorite, is Bank. It is another original idea. since the game takes place at a game show when you kill another player they explode into a bunch of coins, but this time you can pick them up. Another way is opening a vault that also gives coins. Once you think you have enough coins, you can go to a cashout station and deposit all of your coins for your team. I am in love with this game mode for its high level of risk/reward where you can have so many coins just to die and lose them all, or kill Jeff Bezos and see all those coins become yours. Just that feeling of depositing thousands of dollars makes you feel so good.

Destruction!

Every match in THE FINALS is different, but not for the reasons you would think. When you play THE FINALS, you can destroy almost anything. When someone is above you, just break the floor below them. If they are below you, break the ceiling above them. Many of the most effective strategies involve just destroying things. When you reach the end of a match, especially while playing a game mode that takes longer, some skyscrapers have been demolished by sledgehammers or C4. It makes every match different from the rest and makes it so much fun.

I believe that if you have been looking for a fast-paced FPS shooter but COD and any others don't meet your expectations, then you should try THE FINALS.






"Praise Jah In the Moonlight" Song Review
